Make sure your (12) **spelling** (SPELL) and grammar are on point. A review riddled with errors is (13) **confusing** (CONFUSE) to read and may not be taken (14) **seriously** (SERIOUS). To help you write your (15) **evaluation** (EVALUATE), you should record your reactions and (16) **thoughts** (THINK) as you work your way through the novel you're planning on reviewing. One paragraph should include your (17) **assessment** (ASSESS) of the book's (18) **strengths** (STRONG) and (19) **weaknesses** (WEAK). A star rating is (20) **obviously** (OBVIOUS) encouraged on a lot of review sites, but they're not necessary.
